

## BORROWING WEB PAGES and WEB PICTURES

Any HTML web page can be borrowed from the web by saving it as a source file to your disk. All browsers support this feature. Saving the page only saves the HTML code, however. The pictures and graphics on a page are separate files and have to be saved individually. Notice that if you save a web page with flash animation embedded you will not get the animation file, nor can these be saved (which makes turning all pictures into flash graphics a reasonable security measure).

### SAVING WEB PAGES

open any browser on any computer on any operating system  
html is generic and completely cross platform  
navigate to the desired page  
save the page using FILE> SAVE AS...  
navigate to a folder on *your* Zip disk  
set the file type to source, not text, in pull\_down menu  
save the file

### SAVING WEB PICTURES

click and hold on any picture or graphic  
a menu should open with a list of options  
scroll down to 'save this image as...'  
release the mouse  
a SAVE FILE dialog box should open  
navigate to a folder on *your* Zip disk  
save the picture
