

SITE SETUP in DREAMWEAVER

If you buy even the Economy Hosting Plan from Go Daddy they will give you a free Domain Name. After you sign on they will send you an e-mail with your Account Number, User Name, Server Address and Password (that you set).

After that you set up the Server inside of DreamWeaver as follows:

In DreamWeaver:

go to **SITE > MANAGE SITES**
click on **NEW SITE** button (on lower right)

In the **SITE SETUP FOR UNNAMED SITE** window:

under the **SITE** button (on top left):
enter _____ site name (anything you want)
navigate to _____ local site folder (where all your files are)

under the 'server' button:

click on _____ the **[+]** button to add a new server
a sub-window opens

fill in the following information

server name: any name you want (probably your site name)

connect using: FTP

ftp address: supplied by your host
(typically 4 numbers separated by periods)

user name: also supplied by host

password: probably set by you

root directory: typically 'public_html'
(this is the default directory for Go Daddy)

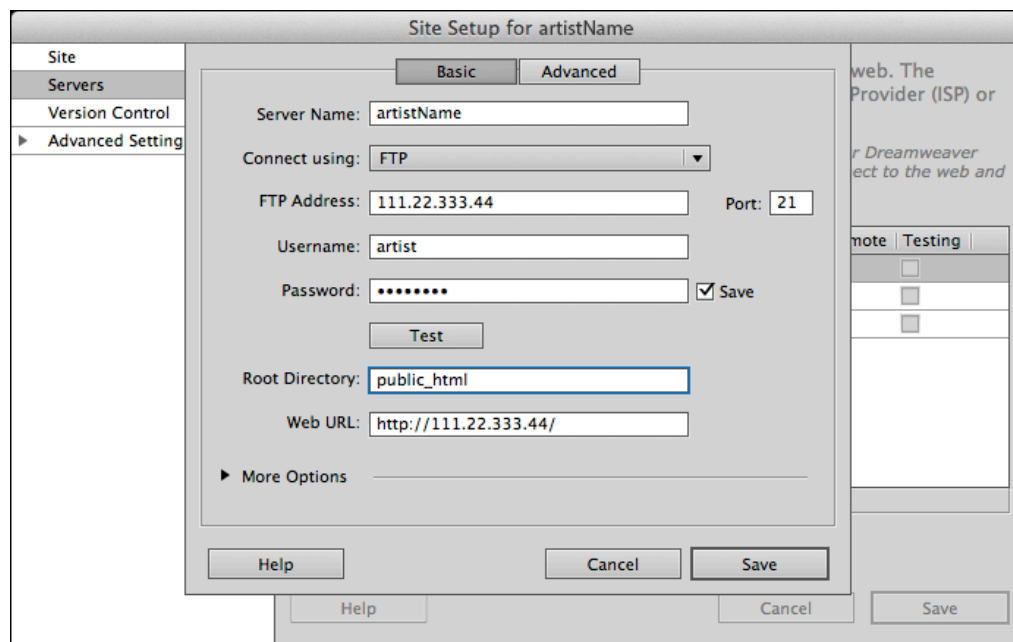
web url: filled in automatically by DreamWeaver

hit _____ the **[TEST]** button to see that the connection to your server works

hit _____ the **[SAVE]** button if it works, or recheck all info

hit _____ **[SAVE]** in the **SITE SETUP** window

hit _____ **[DONE]** in the **MANAGE SITES** window



SAVING and UPLOADING FILES

To upload your site files for the very first time:

open _____ the FILES window
click on _____ the site ROOT folder (the main folder)
hit _____ the [UP ARROW] to upload
 click [YES] when asked if you want to upload the *entire* site
open _____ a browser of your choice (you should check ll 3 eventually...)
type in _____ your url
see _____ how your site looks

From then on you can upload specific files this same way.

select _____ any file or files in the FILES window
hit _____ the [UP ARROW] to upload

Or you can upload when you save any individual file:

hit _____ FILE> SAVE [CMD] S
hit _____ SITE> PUT [CMD] [SHFT] U
